Transport has changed over time as people wanted to go further and faster.

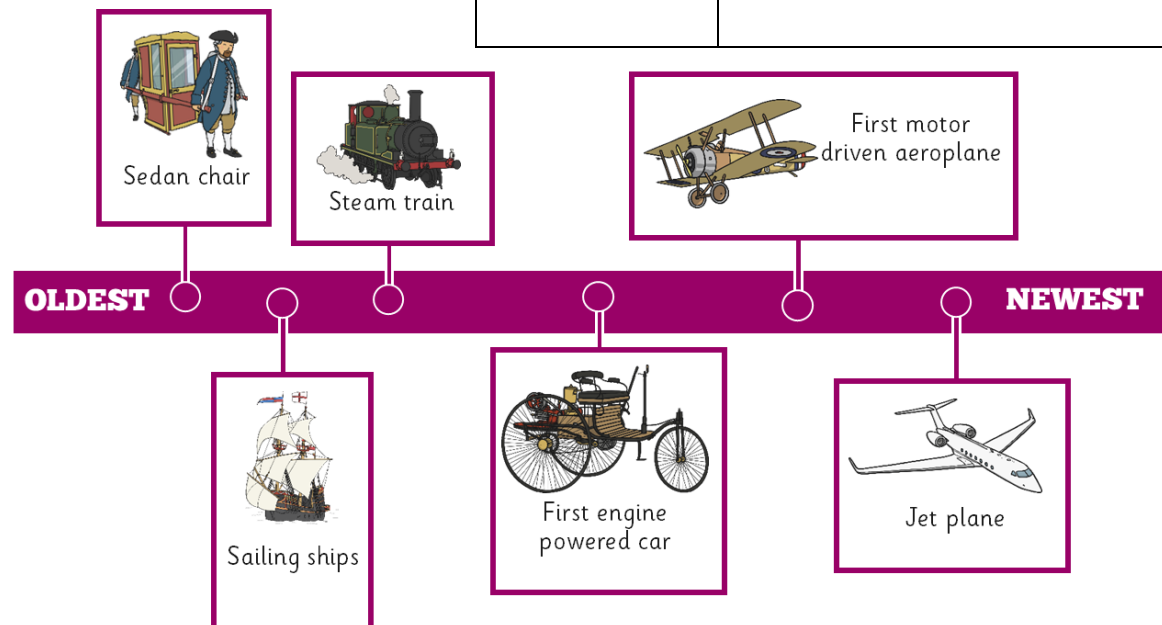
George Stevenson invented the first steam train called Locomotion Number 1.

I know where Africa is on a map.

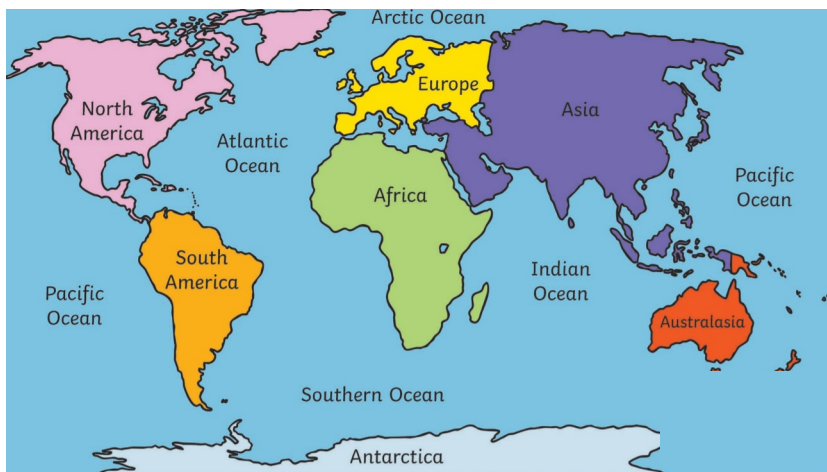
I can name some of the countries in Africa.

Vocabulary

weather	The combination of temperature, wind, rain and other factors.
ocean	A large amount of deep salt water

Equator	An invisible line that divides the earth into northern and southern hemispheres.
Northern hemisphere	The half of the Earth that is north of the equator.
Southern hemisphere	The half of the Earth that is south of the equator.
continent	A large area of land
temperature	A measure of how hot or cold something is.
weather	The way the air and the atmosphere feels. It includes the outside temperature, strength of the wind, and whether it is raining, sunny, hailing, snowing, sleeting, foggy, or cloudy.
